This November, Congress will be making some of the most important, and potentially most dangerous, decisions about budget priorities that we have seen in decades. What are our priorities as a nation? Will Congress squander tens of billions of additional dollars for the Pentagon while making deep cuts to Medicaid and Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)? We will urge Congress to reject more money for war and cuts to security at home.

TELL CONGRESS TO PUT PEOPLE BEFORE THE PENTAGON

Despite the Pentagon admitting to wasting \$125 billion dollars over five years, the president and congressional leaders are calling for even more money to be added to its already bloated budget. The proposed House budget would grow Pentagon spending by \$921 billion over the next ten years while cutting all other discretionary spending by \$1.3 trillion. At the same time, it would require \$4.4 trillion in additional cuts to programs like Medicaid and the SNAP. Nearly 70 million people benefit from Medicaid, and 45 million low-income people, half of them children, receive food assistance through SNAP.

This is fiscally irresponsible policy, and it is immoral, unjust policy. Our budget is a manifestation of our national values and priorities. Will we throw more money at the Pentagon that will only benefit defense contractors and war profiteers, or will we invest in true American security through programs that benefit low-income and middle class people?
