One of BYM's First Campers Reflects on Generations of the Fire Circle, and the Joys of Camp

Jim Riley's family have been Quakers in Winchester, Virginia since the 1720's. He grew up loving the outdoors, camping and hiking in (then) rural Virginia, was a boy scout and went to Boy Scout Camp. In 1955, Baltimore Yearly Meeting rented a 4-H Camp in Western Maryland for Yearly Meeting children which Jim attended. Then, in 1956, Jim spent a week at the newly opened Catoctin Quaker Camp.

There were no cabins then," Jim remembers, "just lean-tos – wooden floors with a tarp for a roof. If it rained, there you were. And the old bathhouse was young! I loved it. Loved being outside, the swimming was great, we looked up to the counselors."

Jim became an assistant counselor at age 15, then served as a Catoctin Quaker Camp counselor, along with Frances Shutz from Charlottesville Meeting. Both families then sent children to camp, who grew into staff and volunteers!

There was a beautiful Friday night ceremony where we made little wooden boats and put candles on them, then floated them in the lake, like stars on the water. And, I especially remember the Fire Circle. I'll never forget how everyone looked, the beauty and community feeling of those wonderful Camp rituals."

Jim, his wife Mary and son Josh have been deeply involved with BYM Camps ever since, and when consensus was reached on need for the Special Campaign for Opequon Quaker Camp, Jim and Mary began talking about making a significant gift as the campaign got started.

Along with celebrating our family's generational, lasting experiences with BYM Camps, every time we talked about the move to Rolling Ridge – such a unique property, really a perfect location – we got more enthusiastic and excited. For us, the Way Opened."
