## Report of the Ad Hoc 350<sup>th</sup>/100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Committee Interim Meeting, October 9, 2021

The Ad Hoc committee charged with organizing anniversary activities for Baltimore Yearly Meeting's 350<sup>th</sup> year is continuing its work on a variety of projects. In an effort to be brief and clear I am highlighting important information about our work for Friends. There are <u>many ways to participate and volunteer</u> and we encourage Friends and Monthly Meetings to become involved in these activities:

- We ask each monthly meeting to designate one person to be a liaison with our committee to receive and share information. We ask that this person be willing to share information about our work to share, and to send us related information from your local meeting.
- Please note that there is an "Anniversary" heading on the BYM website for the latest updates on related activities.
- For the last year we have been asking local meetings to create a history timeline of their meeting, which we are sharing on the BYM website. Several are posted now, and can serve as examples of how to put together your meeting's timeline. Please submit a draft or completed timeline to Mary Braun, BYM Development Director, by December 1, 2021.
- The Quaker Witness sub-committee continues to build a library of resources about on-going BYM concerns, as well as history references. The intent of this project is in the manner of Stone Soup, and asks that Friends please contribute information to their lists of resources. This group has decided to host a monthly drop -in group for discussion of Quaker History & Quaker Witness to take place on the 4th Mondays, beginning September 27th, 7:30 8:30 pm. - Monthly meetings should look for an anniversary curriculum for First Day Schools, which will be distributed in late December/early January. It will consist of 4-5 lessons in the Godly play manner.
- Our Outreach sub-committee is putting together resources for meetings to use for presentations to local community groups about Quakers and Baltimore Yearly Meeting. They are hoping Friends who have previously
